Getting to know each other & intro of the initiative "Urban Spaces»	5'	Intro presentation in power presentation Why are we here today? What are we and why we are collaborating?
Getting to know each other with the students / energiser	5	Each student has to mention something that he/she really likes/ or is good at (i.e. hobby, favorite color). Objective: to realise that we have far more common things to share than we think

<p>Photo Gallery Walk/ Questions and Discussion</p>	<p>15'</p>	<p>Students are invited to a 'photo gallery walk' / photo exhibition that has as key theme: displaced population. Key aim of this exercise is to cultivate empathy, understand where refugees originate from, what forces them to leave their countries etc.</p> <p>Photos are in annex</p>
<p>Game 'Candydrop' Objective: clarify and better understand the term refugee/migrant etc</p>	<p>15'</p>	<p>Candydrop is a multiple choices game during which students place their bets, which in this case are candies. Whoever gives the right reply, gains all the candies of those who have placed their bets on the wrong answer. The questions are about refugees/migrants and key notions</p>
<p>Wrap up/Questions</p>	<p>5'</p>	<p>We either tell children a short story that has also a moral lesson at the end OR We ask students whether they have a question or how they feel</p>
